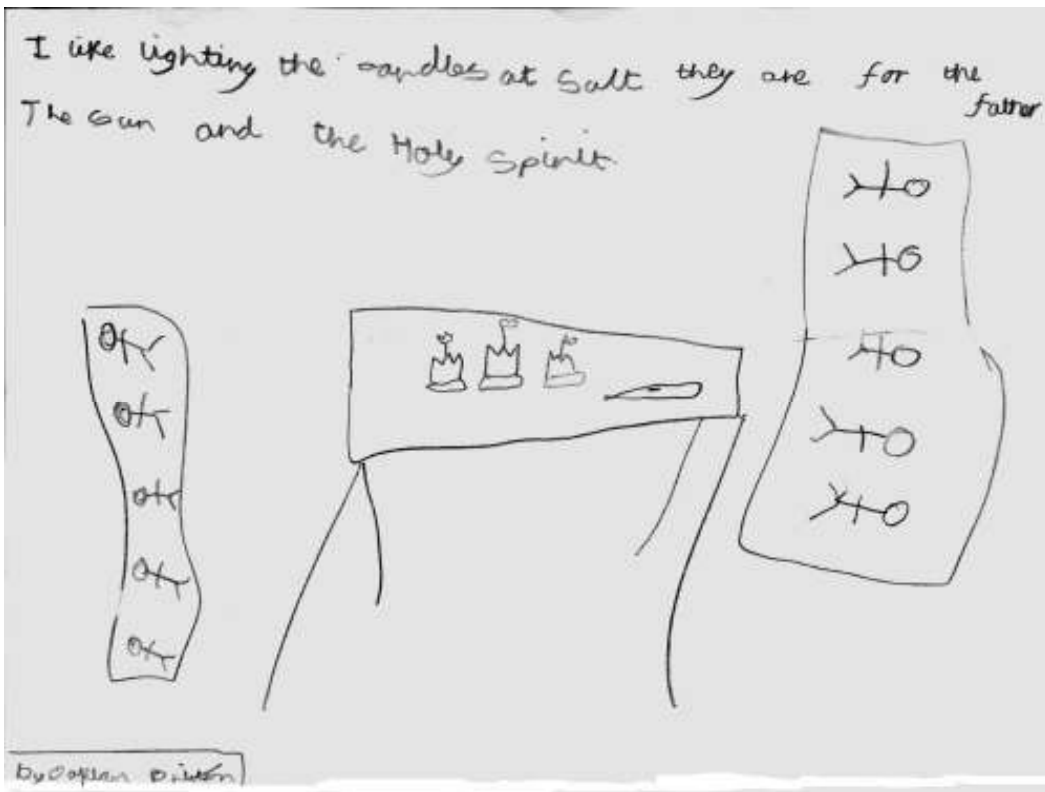
Dear Parish Friends

From 1 July 2007, churches, places of worship, and church halls — both as public buildings and as workplaces — were to be not only non-smoking but must also display signs to say that they are!. I think the use of incense was exempted!

One easy solution was suggested, which would cover the sensibilities of churches yet also comply: lots of churches have notice boards and **No Smoking** notices could be added to other notices displayed on them.

Having worked in The Royal London Hospital and personally nursed many men and women gasping for breath beneath oxygen masks; suffering from brain metastases secondary to Lung Cancer and from other debilitating effects of smoking cigarettes, cigars, pipes and of course illegal substances, I fully supported the Governments initiative wholeheartedly four years ago. The Church cannot 'preach' healing of body, mind and spirit yet offer no help in assisting people move personally towards the wholeness we pray for. Every time we use the Book of Common Prayer for Holy Communion, we pray for the 'Church militant' and ask God that we may be 'godly and quietly governed', praying that the government (of the day) 'may truly and indifferently administer justice'. Attempts to eradicate smoking may seem unjust to smokers but is not the eradication of ill-health a just cause? The eradication of drinking and driving may seem unjust to some who drink and drive but is not the eradication of preventable road traffic accidents and Liver disease a just cause? Attempts to eradicate the use of illegal drug use may seem unjust to drug addicts and dealers but is not the reduction of premature deaths amongst the young a just cause? Is this the business of the Church? Should the Church stay on it's knees, say nothing and do nothing about Health care politics? Jesus walked his talk and so should we.

Sandon WI Meeting June 2011

The meeting started with a fire drill, and the President Eileen Bartrup congratulated all 40 people present on evacuating the hall in two and a half minutes! When we returned to the hall, she welcomed members, a visitor and our Speaker, Mr Ian Kirby and thanked Frances Freemont for flower arrangement on the top table. She was sorry to announce that Martha George who had been a member for many years had recently died.

Mr Ian Kirby then gave a most interesting and amusing talk on the history of the Olympic games and told us that London was the first City to have hosted the games three times, 1908, 1948 and 2012, and at the time of his talk there were only 414 days left until the start of the games next year.

The Games were revived in Athens in 1896 but were often combined with an exhibition as happened at White City in 1908 when the multi purpose stadium had a running track round the outside, a cycling track, and a swimming pool (and the water was not changed for the three weeks that the games lasted!) in the centre of the stadium! The 1948 games held in Wembley Stadium were known as the "austerity games" and were held during the school holidays so local schools could be used as accommodation for the athletes. There had always been plans to redevelop the Stratford area, and being awarded the games for 2012 was a great opportunity. On September 13 2011 the Westfield Shopping Centre will open to the public (there was a Westfield shopping centre at White City) The main aim is that after the games the various facilities will still be used and the Queen Elizabeth park will become the largest urban park in the country. Mr Kirby was thanked by Jean Smith.

Angela Harvey made some announcements about outings, including a visit to Beth Chatto's garden, Little Baddow's garden meeting, a walk from paper Mill Lock followed by a trip on a barge with lunch, a new members coffee morning and the August Open Evening, and then tea was served.

After tea, Barbara Hodges talked about her recent visit to Denman during the Federation weekend and said how very enjoyable it had been. Future events include the Sandon Village fete on June 26th, the Inter Institute Quiz on July 5th, a walk on Tiptree Heath, the August Open evening and a shopping trip to Norwich. The Autumn County meeting will be on October 8th, and there are new speakers days on June 24th and September 23rd, a walk at Church Langley on 10th September, and the schedule for the County Show will be sent out in July.

The Treasurer said we now have a cabinet to store material in, and the Keep Fit and Craft clubs continue to meet. The Flower of the Month was won by Celia kerslake.

The next meeting will be on July 14th when Susan Tyler Damon will talk on " The bride wore white"
