Why do we.....

Use Holy Water

Every Christian in Baptism is washed in water as the outward sign of being cleansed from sin and born to new life in Christ. The symbolism of water is clear - it washes clean and it supports life. From earliest times water has been blessed and used by the Church as a symbol in blessings, dedications, funerals etc and in ceremonial sprinkling as a reminder of Baptism. In many churches there is a stoop or font of holy water near the door. Christians may dip the fingers of the right hand in the water and make the sign of the cross on entering - as a reminder that through the waters of baptism we entered into membership of Christ's Body in the Church. On going out - as a reminder that at Baptism we were signed with the cross and must not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.



Light a Candle

Every Christian at their Baptism passes from darkness to light and is called to shine as a light in the world. Saints and Martyrs have shone as lights in every generation and continue to do so in our own time. It is appropriate that we should pause and light a candle. This is an ancient and wide spread custom and there is nothing superstitious about it, since it is neither a substitute for prayer nor an attempt to buy God's favour. Lighting a candle is a sign - a sign of our prayer and the offering of our lives, a reminder to us and to others of the saints and martyrs who have shone as the lights of the world, and who pray for us a witness to all that pass by that this is a place of prayer.



Go to Confession

To repent and to be pardoned for our offences. There is no rule that states what the regularity of confession should be although some people have regular appointments with their confessor; others go when they feel the need or when something particular is troubling them. Often confession is linked to spiritual guidance or discussion with the priest.

Known as; Malcolm or Mystery (Mr.E)
I arrived in Sandon in September 1977. Some would argue that Butts Green is not really Sandon
The Reason that I came was for a larger garden, the rural setting and a house that could be extended to accommodate my mother-in-law.
My ambition as a child included being a seaman in the Royal navy or a farmer.
Any Resemblance to my present occupation is difficult to assess but I have always had a great interest in gardening and practical work as well as having found and practiced a vocation in engineering as a profession so it would seem that there could be a connection.

The main Life Lesson experienced has been that there is something deeper to life than merely existing and, whatever the situation, it could be worse.

I became a Christian by a process combined of family upbringing, education in school and Sunday school, friends and fiancée, church going and a need to get to grips with an inner conviction that there was always a better direction in which to try to make progress in a spiritual sense.

What do you like about Sandon Church? is a leading question. I started going to Sandon church because the people were friendly and it held an evening Service which my own church did not have. Now these two features have been modified by various changes in congregation and Service patterns. Being a lot older now, I value being allowed space in which to be quiet and think and to participate in and understand the liturgy.

My belief in miracles varies. I can take on board those related in the Bible without too much of a problem and accept those related to me and other people who have experienced them but when I have requested what amounted to being a physical miracle e.g. healing, the answer to my prayer has not been revealed. It could be that the problem lies within myself. If miracles are classed as answer to prayer then I have experienced them in other circumstances

My hope for the future lies in the fact that the Christian Church generally remains true to the teaching of the Bible and preaches the gospel to whoever will listen. Growth in some areas shows that the Holy Spirit is still at work wherever he is welcomed.

I am an introvert and do not socialise willingly. Mixing and talking to people is very hard work so I have not become a good teacher or preacher.

Coffee or tea? seems to be a strange question but I prefer tea at whatever the time of day. Coffee must be drunk only at 11.00am or after dinner (with port).

Those life experiences which have been most special are varied. They range from when I was baptised by immersion as a teenager, my first day in the army, when my wife said she would marry me through to when our children were born. My professional career also brought about new special experiences through new responsibilities, successes in experimentation and failures when least expected.

A number of films and books have moved me. The Robe, Dr Zhivago, Gandhi and recently C H Spurgeon, the 'People's Preacher' are among the most memorable. I look to books for entertainment and I am attracted by the storytelling of Bernard Cornwell in his Lord Utrud series and Richard Sharpe tales. However 'Amazing Grace', a book of the film about William Wilberforce and his campaigns to abolish slavery and to reform manners and behaviour, is moving because it describes the enormity of both tasks facing him in the society of the time. He couldn't have done it without his Christian faith.

My favourite part of the Bible is difficult to identify. The bits that stand out start in the Old Testament, in particular the prophesy by Isaiah about a new king to come from the line of David (Isaiah Ch 11) which gave people hope. This reinforces the claims of Jesus in the New Testament such as 'I am the light of the world' (John Ch 8 v 12). The third part is where Jesus appears to his disciples on the road to Emmaus and on other occasions continuing to the giving of the Holy Spirit, recorded in Acts.

Words that are especially inspiring are in John Ch3 v 16 'For God loved the world so much that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but may have eternal life'

Those qualities that I value in another are honesty, love and a good sense of humour.

The behaviour that I find most difficult to tolerate concerns lack of discipline. Firstly in children towards any form of authority and without thought for others and secondly in adults who act selfishly and sometimes even criminally for their own gain.

Night or morning person? In my youth I was most awake in the evening/early hours but now in old age I am not at my best at either time but definitely worse in the morning.

The season I prefer is Autumn when we still have some warmth during the day, there is usually some rain for the garden and there could be some fruit and vegetables to harvest. The idea of winter is only a small cloud on the horizon.

A moment when I felt the presence of God was when, during a church meeting, I realised that He was calling me to a particular office and that was why I had moved home, not just to get a better lifestyle.

I have a lot of favourite hymns - three stand out, namely "Just as I am, without one plea.....", "Breathe on me breath of God" and "What a friend we have in Jesus". Then there's "O Lord my God, when I in awesome wonder" and so on and so on.

Religion and politics cannot be separated because they are concerned with life and living. However I would not want the term 'politics' to be confused with party politics but to be linked with policies and ideas about justice, peace and freedom.

While I have no friends from other faiths in my professional life I have worked with Muslims and Hindus. If by 'other faiths' other denominations of Christianity are meant, then I have many friends from other faiths.

I am looking forward to the time when, once more I can do something constructive for somebody else.

In the totally unlikely event that I had a large sum available, I would donate it to the charity Mission Aviation Fellowship because it covers all aspects of Christian ministry through its fleet of aircraft which operate in many underdeveloped countries in Africa, South America and Asia.

The single thing that I would save from a fire would be all my family history files that contain data collected over many years. Note that I don't regard other people or animals as "things" so would naturally consider them first.

If an 18 year old would listen to me it would be to advise that person to really look at the life of Jesus and see, by talking to other people and looking at their lifestyles, what he has to offer before doing anything else.

The moment of my life that I would most like to relive is when, on retirement I realised that I no longer had any real financial worries and could be free of commercial commitments - and then came the recession.

The age that I would most like to be is 65 years because then I was relatively fit and could still work quite hard.

My special interests are light aircraft, mechanical engineering technology, family history research, reading (mostly fiction), gardening, DIY carpentry and building work. Unfortunately the last two seem to take precedence and I have been banned from the skies! M.E.
