The First Reading

Romans 5:1-5

Access to God's peace and hope is through Jesus, who reveals God's grace for our lives; through grace, the Spirit pours God's loving inspiration into our lives.

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

The Gospel Reading

John 16:12-15

Wisdom speaks truth out loud, taking what the Father gave Jesus and guiding the disciples to take and share this life.

¹²I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the

Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.
