

Collect

Eternal Father,
whose Son Jesus Christ ascended to the throne of
heaven
that he might rule over all things as Lord and
King:
keep the Church in the unity of the Spirit
and in the bond of peace,
and bring the whole created order to worship at his
feet;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading Revelation 1. 4b-8

4 John to the seven churches that are in Asia:
Grace to you and peace from him who is and who
was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits
who are before his throne, 5 and from Jesus Christ,
the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and
the ruler of the kings of the earth.

To him who loves us and freed² us from our sins by
his blood, 6 and made³ us to be a kingdom, priests
serving⁴ his God and Father, to him be glory and
dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

7 Look! He is coming with the clouds;

every eye will see him,

even those who pierced him;

and on his account all the tribes of the earth will
wail.

So it is to be. Amen.

8 'I am the Alpha and the Omega', says the Lord
God, who is and who was and who is to come, the
Almighty.

Gospel John 18. 33-37

33 Then Pilate entered the headquarters* again,
summoned Jesus, and asked him, 'Are you the King
of the Jews?' 34 Jesus answered, 'Do you ask this on
your own, or did others tell you about me?' 35 Pilate
replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and
the chief priests have handed you over to me. What
have you done?' 36 Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is
not from this world. If my kingdom were from this
world, my followers would be fighting to keep me
from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my
kingdom is not from here.' 37 Pilate asked him, 'So
you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am
a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into
the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who
belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

giftaid it

What if I pay income tax at the higher rate?

The church can only reclaim tax back at the basic rate.
But you can claim back the difference between the
higher rate and the basic rate on your Self Assessment
return, or via the P810 Tax Review form from your Tax
Office. You might like to take this into account when
working out your level of giving.

I don't pay tax, but my spouse does. Can I still use Gift Aid?

No. Only a tax payer can use the scheme. The best thing
is for your spouse to complete a Declaration.

Can I count tax other than income tax when giving under Gift Aid?

Yes. Capital gains tax, tax credits on dividend income,
and tax deducted from bank and building society
interest (provided you have not reclaimed it) can all be
used to cover the tax on your gifts.

Suppose I move?

You can cancel your Declaration at your old church, and
complete a new Declaration at the new church.
