Reading Exodus 2 1-10

(Moses in the Basket)

Moses' mother had to entrust her little baby boy into God's hands. She put him in a basket and placed him on the River Nile. Entrusting this little bundle into the hands of Almighty God was the best act of love she could have taken.

In God's hands, Moses ended up being brought up by Pharaoh's daughter; hence he became a Prince of Egypt. Note the journey however that Moses took – placed in a basket by his mother's hands – picked up by Pharaoh's daughter's slave girl out of the river – and then the basket opened by Pharaoh's daughter herself.

Look at the number of hands that were used in order for God to fulfil His purpose for that little child.

When we place things in God's hands He uses the hands of others to fulfil His purpose.

In this shoebox celebration service, we recognise His hands are on every box, just like they were on Moses' basket, but He involves us in the preparation, processing and provision of those boxes to their end destination. Hence we celebrate HIS HANDS, YOUR HANDS and OUR HANDS, working together with Him in partnership. Thank You, Lord, for all those who have been involved in Operation Christmas Child and for all the boxes that will give so many children a sense of value, love and recognition.

Walking Backwards to Christmas by Stephen Cottrell

Using the brilliant, deceptively simple device of telling the Christmas story backwards, Stephen Cottrell helps us encounter it as if for the first time. Narrating the story from the perspective of key characters gives us insights into its many horrors and uncertainties as well as its joys. Each imaginative reflection is prefaced by a Bible reading and followed by a prayer.
