Reading Micah 4 4-5

And he will judge among many people,

and they will reshape their swords as ploughshares
and their spears as pruning hooks.
No nation will threaten another,
nor will they train for war anymore.
Instead, each man will sit in the shade of his grape
vines and beneath the shade of his fig tree,"
since the Lord of the Heavenly Armies has spoken.

each person in the name of his God,

Gospel Reading John 14 22 -27

Judas (not Iscariot) asked him, "Lord, how is it that you are going to reveal yourself to us and not to the world?"
Jesus answered him, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word. Then my Father will love him, and we will go to him and make our home within him. The one who doesn't love me doesn't keep my words. The words that you're hearing me say are not mine, but come from the Father who sent me.
"I have told you this while I am still with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything that I have told you. I'm leaving you at peace. I'm giving you my own peace. I'm not giving it to you as the world gives. So don't let your hearts be troubled, and don't be afraid.
