## Reading Zechariah 9 9 -10

### The Coming King

<sup>9</sup> "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion!

Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem!

Behold, your King is coming to you;

He *is* just and having salvation,

Lowly and riding on a donkey,

A colt, the foal of a donkey.

<sup>10</sup> I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim

And the horse from Jerusalem;

The battle bow shall be cut off.

He shall speak peace to the nations;

His dominion *shall be* 'from sea to sea,

And from the River to the ends of the earth.'

## Gospel Reading Mark 11 1 - 10

### The Triumphal Entry

<sup>11</sup> Now when they drew near Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, He sent two of His disciples; <sup>2</sup> and He said to them, "Go into the village opposite you; and as soon as you have entered it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has sat. Loose it and bring it. <sup>3</sup> And if anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord has need of it,' and immediately he will send it here."

<sup>4</sup> So they went their way, and found the colt tied by the door outside on the street, and they loosed it. <sup>5</sup> But some of those who stood there said to them, "What are you doing, loosing the colt?"

<sup>6</sup> And they spoke to them just as Jesus had commanded. So they let them go. <sup>7</sup> Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their clothes on it, and He sat on it. <sup>8</sup> And many spread their clothes on the road, and others cut down leafy branches from the trees and spread *them* on the road.

<sup>9</sup> Then those who went before and those who followed cried out, saying:

"Hosanna!

'Blessed *is* He who comes in the name of the Lord!

<sup>10</sup> Blessed *is* the kingdom of our father David That comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest!"
